

HOTCHKISS BUILDING!

CHECK THIS OUT! This must be the Hotchkiss Building when it was first constructed. Browsing thru Morrison's History of Lyons, 1877, this is what appeared and what was written:

"Jacob Leach built a frame upon Water Street in 1812, and opened a general assortment of goods." Notice the boat in the Clyde River, the bridge to the east and the Leach Mills on the other side of the river. Hiram I bought the building in 1880 for his Bottle Works.
